

Resolution of the Town of Christiansburg Planning Commission

Conditional Use Permit Application

WHEREAS the Christiansburg Planning Commission, acting upon a request by Peggy A. Beasley for property located at 275 Starlight Drive (tax parcel 529 – ((A)) – 13) for a flea market in the B-3 General Business District, has found following a duly advertised Public Hearing that the public necessity, convenience, general welfare and good zoning practices (**permit / ~~do not permit~~**) the issuance of a CUP to Peggy A. Beasley for property located at 275 Starlight Drive (tax parcel 529 – ((A)) – 13) for a flea market in the B-3 General Business District.

THEREFORE be it resolved that the Christiansburg Planning Commission (**recommends / ~~does not recommend~~**) that the Christiansburg Town Council approve the issuance of the Conditional Use Permit with the following condition(s):

1. The property is to be maintained in a clean, sanitary, and sightly manner.
2. The outside market shall only be allowed to operate from 7:00 a.m. to sundown.
3. All vendors are required to pack out all of their trash, garbage, boxes, unsold items, etc.
4. Dumping of chemicals, oil, sewage, etc. into storm drains or anywhere else on the property is not permitted.
5. No campers or overnight camping.
6. Vendors selling prepared foods shall obtain Town Business Licenses and collect and file Town meals taxes.
7. The flea market organizers and all vendors shall meet all applicable federal, state and local regulations and requirements.
8. This permit shall be valid for operation of the flea market by Peggy A. Beasley only and is nontransferable.
9. The permit approval shall be subject to review in twelve months.
10. This permit shall exempt Peggy A. Beasley from installing paved parking spaces. Any future tenant or use shall comply with all parking requirements.





Conditional Use Permit Application

WHEREAS the Christiansburg Planning Commission, acting upon a request by the Christiansburg Town Council to study a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) request made by SHAH Development, LLC for property located at 2765 Roanoke Street (tax parcel 501 – ((1)) – 26A) for residential use in the B-3 General Business District, has found following a duly advertised Public Hearing that the public necessity, convenience, general welfare and good zoning practices (**permit / ~~do not permit~~**) the issuance of a CUP to SHAH Development, LLC for property located at 2765 Roanoke Street (tax parcel 501 – ((1)) – 26A) for residential use in the B-3 General Business District.

THEREFORE be it resolved that the Christiansburg Planning Commission (**recommends / ~~does not recommend~~**) that the Christiansburg Town Council approve the issuance of the Conditional Use Permit with the following condition(s):

1. The development shall be in general conformity with the presented “Proposed Site Layout Patricia Lane Townhomes C.U.P. Concept Plan” dated August 29, 2014 and revised on November 11, 2014.
2. The development shall comply with all applicable stormwater regulations.





The Town wants to know what you want in your neighborhood!

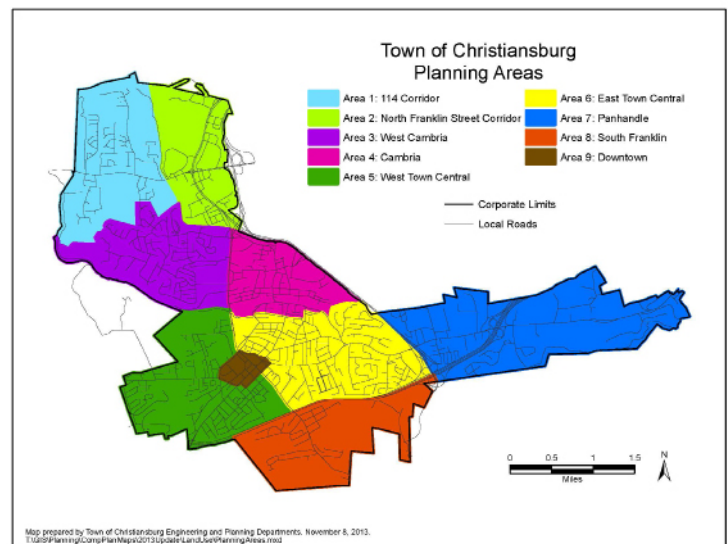
Is there something you would like to see in your neighborhood? What about something you think could be improved? We want to hear about it!

Frequently Asked...

What causes water breaks?

You may have noticed that at some times throughout the year, water breaks appear to be more common.

This is quite normal. As the seasons change, the ground shifts as temperatures fluctuate. This causes items in the ground to shift as well, which may result in water breaks. For this reason, you may notice more water breaks occur in the fall and spring.

Another factor that may lead to water breaks is the aging of infrastructure. For this reason, the Town continually works to identify areas that may need improvements so that service always remains top quality.

Project Up-Date

December 19, 2014

GIS DIVISION

NRVECRA GSI Data Merge

Description: The Town of Christiansburg, Town of Blacksburg, Montgomery County, and Virginia Tech are participating members of the New River Valley Emergency Communications Regional Authority (NRVECRA). The four members are combining and formatting their respective GIS data for utilization by the new Regional E911 Dispatch Center.

Status: The initial data sets will be completed for the Dispatch Center by January 10, 2015.

Utility Infrastructure Inventory

Description: The Town's water, sanitary sewer, and stormwater infrastructures are in a constant state of change. With new development improvements and ongoing maintenance, the GIS mapping is regularly updated.

Status: The sanitary sewer and water system data are generally complete. The current effort underway is to identify the ages of the systems for the benefit of asset management. The stormwater system data is approximately 60% complete and is being updated in support of the MS-4 Stormwater Program.

ArcGIS Server/ArcGIS Online

Description: Using ESRI's ArcGIS Server the Town is now able to develop web applications that can be made available to the public. These applications will allow limited public access to online Town maps and information. Employees will be able to access and edit GIS data in the field which will make GIS data gathering more efficient and effective.

Status: These online maps and applications are in the planning and development stage. The GIS division currently anticipates rolling out a limited number of these products for review and consideration in the first quarter of 2015.

UTILITY DIVISION, WATER AND WASTEWATER

A Fixed Term Services contact for Water and Wastewater Civil Engineering Services was executed in March, 2014 with four professional engineering consulting firms. The firms include Anderson & Associates, Inc., CHA Consulting, Inc., Hurt & Proffitt, Inc. and Peed and Bortz, L.L.C. The following contains a brief description and status of projects primarily as advertised with the RFP.

Water System Projects

Effective Storage, Phase 3, Lubna Pump Station

Description: Installation of a pressure booster station in the Lubna Drive area of the water system to increase to Town's water supply effective storage capacity.

Status: Design is 90% complete and will be submitted to VDH by the first of January, 2015.

Roanoke Street Waterline Replacement

Description: Work under this engineering contract studies the replacement of approximately 6,000 linear feet of water main along Roanoke Street from East Main Street to Depot Street.

Status: A Request for Proposals (RFP) issuance is pending. Deliverables by the consultant include a Virginia Department of Health approved Preliminary Engineering Report identifying recommended improvements and the associated costs for the Capital Improvement Plan.

AMI Water Metering System Up-Grade

Description: Work under this contract either replaces or retrofits all of the Town's approximate 10,000 water meters. This electronic data gathering system replaces the current manual read system and provides benefits such as monthly billing capabilities, remote meter shut-off, hourly customer water usage monitoring and system wide leak detection and analysis.

Status: A contract has been executed with Mueller Systems, Inc. for the installation and implementation of the AMI system. An initial kick-off meeting was held December 16, 2014. Field data collector installation is in the planning stage and behind the scene coordination between Mueller Systems and our water billing software provider, Cogsdale, is underway. Prior to meter installation, a customer communication and education plan will be implemented.

Concrete Water Tank PRV Installation

Description: Project consists of removal of the concrete water tanks and the installation of a pressure reducing valve to facilitate acceptable customer water service pressure.

Status: Project will commence upon completion of the Lubna Water Booster Station. Storage in the Concrete Tanks is needed until that time.

Cambria Water System Improvement Project

Description: Work under this contract studies the Cambria Water System with respect to level of service, fire flow capacity, storage capacity, water pressure, infrastructure age, and overall system condition including the town's 250,000 gallon Cambria Water Tank.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants was issued and a contract for engineering services has been executed with CHA Consulting, Inc. A Preliminary Engineering Report will be prepared with recommended improvements and the associated costs for the Capital Improvement Plan.

Water System Up-Grade, Phase 6

Description: This project improves the Town's ability to supply water to the eastern portion of Town and Montgomery County by the installation of a 16-inch waterline along Depot Street to Hungate Street thus allowing removal of the Stone's Pump Station from service.

Status: Construction has been completed and the system has been placed into operation. Water service connections, other water system modifications and paving of portions of Depot Street in the spring are planned.

Edgewood and Craig Mountain Water Pump Station Up-Grades

Description: Engineering study to upgrade the Edgewood and Craig Mountain Water Pumping Stations with modern pumping controls and equipment.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants was issued and a contract for engineering services has been executed with Peed and Bortz, L.L.C. A kick-off meeting has been conducted on December 17, 2014 with the consultant. A Preliminary Engineering Report will be prepared with recommended improvements and the associated costs for the Capital Improvement Plan.

West Main Street Water Main Replacement

Description: Work under this contract replaces approximately 4,250 L.F. of waterline replacement along West Main Street, beginning near the intersection with Chrisman Street and ending near the intersection with Moose Drive.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants is pending. A contract for engineering services will be executed with the successful consultant. A Preliminary Engineering Report will be prepared with recommended improvements and the associated costs for the Capital Improvement Plan.

Railroad Street Water Main Extension

Description: Extension of a water main in North Franklin Street from Sara Street to Railroad Street thus providing a reliable water service to the Railroad Street residents.

Status: L.A.S. Trucking successfully completed this construction after their identification and correction of deficiencies as a result of improper installation.

Hills Water Tank Anchor Installation

Description: Project consists of the design and installation of an anchoring system thus providing extra protection in the event of seismic activity.

Status: Design is 50% complete. Construction is planned for spring 2015.

Wastewater Projects

College Street Drainage Basin Inflow & Infiltration Reduction Project

Description: This project consists of implementation of the Town's College Street Infiltration and Inflow Reduction Plan.

Status: This project is 95% complete. The contractor is waiting for delivery of remaining project materials for installation.

Crab Creek Trunk Main Modeling and Upgrade Study

Description: This project consists of studying the Town's wastewater interceptor from the Town's wastewater treatment plant to I-81 in town.

Status: A RFP was issued to the Term Services consultants and a contract for engineering services has been executed with CHA Consulting, Inc. A Preliminary Engineering Report will be prepared with recommended improvements and the associated

costs for the Capital Improvement Plan. The project kick-off meeting was held on December 19, 2014.

Cambria Drainage Basin Inflow & Infiltration Reduction Project

Description: This project consists of studying the Town's wastewater infrastructure in the Cambria area of town.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants is pending. A contract for engineering services will be executed with the successful consultant. A Preliminary Engineering Report will be prepared with recommended improvements and the associated costs for the Capital Improvement Plan.

TRANSPORTATION DIVISION

A Fixed Term Services contract for Transportation Engineering Services was executed in December 1, 2014 with four professional engineering consulting firms. The firms include Anderson & Associates, Inc., Gay and Neel, Inc., McCormick Taylor, Inc. and Wiley & Wilson, Inc. The following contains a brief description and status of projects primarily as advertised with the RFP.

Pavement Management

Description: Paving of streets which qualify for resurfacing under the VDOT Revenue Sharing Program.

Status: Streets are being compiled for a spring 2015 paving contract. Public Works will be performing maintenance to the shoulders and ditches of the streets selected in advance of the paving operation.

Park Street Storm Drainage and Street Improvements

Description: This project consists of storm drain system improvements and street improvements which will include sidewalks and curb and gutter.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants is pending. A contract for engineering services will be executed with the successful consultant. Plans, specifications and contract documents will be prepared and the project will be bid for construction in the spring.

Huckleberry Tail Phase IID Extension

Description: This project provides for the continued extension of the Huckleberry Trail towards Independence Boulevard and downtown Christiansburg. The extension will begin at the intersection of Providence Boulevard and Cambria Street and will extend to the Food Lion Shopping Center through the property donated to the Town by Jean and Roger Woody, also known as Woody Park.

Status: Gay & Neel, Inc. has completed the plans, specifications and contract documents. Plans are currently in to VDOT for final review and approval. Construction is anticipated to begin by the spring of 2015.

Huckleberry Tail Phase III Extension

Description: This project provides for the continued extension of the Huckleberry Trail to Independence Boulevard and downtown Christiansburg. The extension will begin near the Food Lion Shopping Center and will extend through or around Oak Tree Development to the Christiansburg High School Property.

Status: Staff is currently evaluating the alternative trail locations for eventual discussion with property owners. Plan development is anticipated to be completed by the summer of 2015.

North Franklin Street / Independence Boulevard Deceleration Lane Extension

Description: This project extends the existing substandard deceleration lane on North Franklin Street.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants is pending. A contract for engineering services will be executed with the successful consultant. Plans, specifications and contract documents will be prepared. It is anticipated the project will be bid for construction in the summer of 2015.

Downtown Street Improvement, Phase 1B

Description: This project improves sidewalks and the storm drainage system on the south side of East Main Street adjacent to the Emergency Services Building and on South Franklin Street from Main Street to First Street. The project will include the installation of new traffic signals at the square.

Status: Plans, Specifications and contract documents have been prepared by Gay and Neel, Inc. and have been approved by VDOT for advertisement. The advertisement for construction will be advertised in the Roanoke Times on Sunday, December 21, 2014.

Trail System Study

Description: This limited study will study potential trail extension projects in support of the Bikeway / Walkway Committees commitment to identify possible projects for funding.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants is pending. A contract for engineering services will be executed with the successful consultant. A report will be prepared for review and input from the Bikeway / Walkway Committee and for presentation to Town Council.

Chrisman Mill Road Railroad Crossing Improvements

Description: This project improves the alignment and safety of the at-grade crossing of Chrisman Mill Road and the Norfolk Southern rail line.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants is pending. A contract for engineering services will be executed with the successful consultant. Plans, specifications and contract documents will be prepared. It is anticipated the project will be bid for construction in the summer of 2015.

Traffic Calming Study – Miller, Alleghany and Ellett

Description: This projects studies the effect on speed and traffic volume after installation of traffic calming measures which include increased fine signage and speed tables.

Status: The field data collection ended in early December. The data has been analyzed and a report prepared for staff review by Mr. Sam Bower, statistical consultant and volunteer. A presentation is planned at a near future Street Committee meeting.

ENVIRONMENTAL DIVISION

A Fixed Term Services contract for Civil and Environmental Engineering, Stormwater Drainage System and Stream Restoration Design Services is in the final stage of execution with five professional engineering consulting firms. The firms include A. Morton Thomas and Associates, Inc., EEE Consulting, Inc., Gay and Neel, Inc., Michael Baker Engineering, Inc. and Wetland Studies and Solutions, Inc. The following contains a brief description and status of projects primarily as advertised with the RFP.

Towne Branch Stream Restoration

Description: The project consists of improving Towne Branch from the Depot Park to the Christiansburg Skate Park utilizing natural stream channel restoration design. The

design will incorporate a trail extension from the skate park to the existing Depot Park trail. Restoration of the channel will incorporate the historical aspect of the former Mill Lane grist mill.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants will be issued before the Christmas holiday. A contract for engineering services will be executed with the successful consultant. Plans, specifications and contract documents will be prepared. It is anticipated the project will be bid for construction in the summer of 2015.

Brown, Church and Lucas Storm Drainage Improvements

Description: The project consists of improving the storm drainage system to minimize local flooding in the Lucas Street, Brown Street and Church Street area.

Status: The project plans, specifications and contract documents are nearing completion. It is anticipated the project will be bid for construction in the spring of 2015.

Church, Rigby and Ellett Storm Drainage Improvements

Description: The project consists of improving the storm drainage system to minimize local flooding in the Church Street, Rigby Street and Ellett Street area.

Status: The project plans, specifications and contract documents are nearing completion. It is anticipated the project will be bid for construction in the spring of 2015.

Diamond Hills Stream Restoration, Phase II

Description: The project consists of improving a section of the tributary adjacent to Blue Leaf Court which drains to the Diamond Hills Park Stream Restoration Project. Natural stream channel design techniques and principals will be utilized.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants will be issued after the Christmas holiday. A contract for engineering services will be executed with the successful consultant. Plans, specifications and contract documents will be prepared. It is anticipated the project will be bid for construction in the summer of 2015.

Hans Meadow Drive Drainage Improvements

Description: The project consists of improving the storm drainage system to minimize local flooding along Hans Meadow Drive.

Status: A RFP to the Term Services consultants will be issued after the Christmas holiday. A contract for engineering services will be executed with the successful consultant. Plans, specifications and contract documents will be prepared. It is anticipated the project documents will be completed by the summer of 2015.
