ITEM HISTORY:

On 11-1-2017 the Finance Committee, Councilman Stipes and Councilman Showalter met with staff, (Randy Wingfield, Val Tweedie, Dave Brahmstadt, Mark Sisson, Jim Lancianese, Travis Moles) and discussed each item presented in this amendment. The finance committee has vetted each item presented and recommends approval of this budget amendment following the public hearing scheduled for November 28, 2017.

In the original approved budget for 2017-2018 it was projected that our beginning special revenue fund balance would be \$681,879 and general fund balance would be \$20,424,968. At the end of the fiscal year the fund balance for the special revenue fund was \$832,716 an increase of \$150,837 and for the general fund the unassigned fund balance was \$23,982,472 a rollover of an additional \$3,557,504 in available unassigned general fund balance. The budget amendment requests the use of \$1,908,161 of the \$3,557,504 in the general fund balance to adjust for rollovers of budget items not expended before the end of the fiscal year but already committed for completion. There are several new grant awards for capital projects, and a new economic development project for streets, sidewalks and storm water pond improvements. The amendment provides for adjustment in our pay plan for sworn law enforcement officers to remedy pay disparity issues, adds a new position to public works at no cost due to restructuring for better efficiency, adds a special events coordinator to handle the farmers market and all special events for the town.

There is also additional support from the general fund for the storm drain enterprise of \$43,901 to repair a collapsed storm drain on Pepper's Ferry Road of \$50,000 and adjustment of carryover budget amounts for several other storm drain capital projects. The additional support for the Water and Sewer Enterprise is \$126,000 for an emergency repair of a collapsed sewer line on Independence and to adjust the carryover budget amounts for several capital projects in the fund.

Several changes in the special revenue funds require the use of \$67,120 of the additional \$150,837 of available special revenue fund balance.

Detailed line item changes are attached for all requested changes in all funds.

DESCRIPTION:

The request is comprised of two applications:

- 1) A request to Rezone 13.071 acres of tax parcels 530-(2)-85B, 86A, 87A, 530-(A)-1, located on the corner of Glade Drive, S.E. and Curtis Drive, S.E. from A, Agricultural to R-3 Multi-Family Residential with two proffered conditions.
- 2) A request for a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) on the same property for a Planned Housing Development in the R-3, Multi-Family Residential District. The proposed development is for up to 60 single-family homes. The consideration of the CUP request is contingent upon the outcome of the rezoning request.

The Planning Commission held its public hearing on October 30, 2017. On November 20, 2017, the Planning Commission made the following recommendations:

- 1) Recommendation of approval by a vote of 6-0 of the Rezoning application with two proffered conditions by the Applicant.
- 2) Recommendation of approval by a vote of 5-1 of the Conditional Use Permit request for a Planned Housing Development with four conditions.

I. Call to Order

II. Discussions by Mayor and Council Members

- A. Mowing/maintenance of Town and Virginia Department of Transportation rights-of-way. Town Manager Wingfield detailed areas of VDOT maintenance in town and the area near the Christiansburg Recreation Center and the area near Lowe's appeared to be the only areas of concern. Mr. Wingfield stated that VDOT will only mow a few times a year and that budget constraints prevent regular mowing. David Clarke, Christiansburg VDOT Resident Engineer, stated that this was the case. Discussion of the Town doing the mowing through an agreement with VDOT coupled with a more regular schedule from VDOT would help the situation and there was discussion of planting wildflowers in the area near the Recreation Center.
- B. Review of Farmers' Market insurance requirements. Town Manager Wingfield stated that the insurance recommendation was from Town Attorney Fontana as a protection for the town and said that some localities will form a non-profit for the management of farmers' markets. Town Manager Wingfield and Public Relations Director Powell stated that the insurance requirement seemed to be encouraged by the existing vendors and that policies only cost a few hundred for a stand-alone policy and can be a rider to homeowners insurance. Discussion turned to support for the market and the desire to show a commitment to the vendors including physical improvements ranging from benches, the proposed archway, and string lights to more permanent changes like street closure or structures.
- C. Photo project at Town facilities. Town Manager Wingfield and Public Relations Director Powell provided a slideshow with potential themes including photos by era, subject matter, structures, events, Council members and staff, and citizens. Structure which could be included could be the Aquatic Center, Recreation Center, and Town Hall. Photos could be individually hung which would be more easily moved to other locations versus a wrap and they could rotate locations. Larry Middleton and Roy Kanode were mentioned as sources for photos.

III. PUBLIC HEARINGS

- A. Conditional Use Permit request by Linda S. McMurray, agent for J & E Inc., for a kennel (animal daycare/overnight boarding) at 569 North Franklin Street in the B-3, General Commercial District. The property is designated as Business/Commercial on the Future Land Use Map of the 2013 Christiansburg Comprehensive Plan.

Linda McMurray, applicant, reported that she opened a pet retail and grooming business yesterday at 569 North Franklin Street, and is requesting a CUP to offer daycare services and overnight boarding. She explained her plan of care for dogs, kennel size, and outdoor run areas. Ms. McMurray offered to answer questions of Council.

Desiree Swindell, 1395 Dow Street, spoke in favor of the CUP request, expressing her plans to support the business with her dogs. She currently uses the dog park in Radford and boards with a friend.

Faren Wolter, 1370 Dow Street, voiced her support for the CUP, noting that she currently boards her dogs in Newport.

IV. CONSENT AGENDA

- A. Council meeting minutes of October 24, 2017.
- B. Resolution Recognizing Todd Walters for his service to the Town of Christiansburg.
- C. Schedule Public Hearing on January 9, 2018 for a Conditional Use Permit request by Walmart Real Estate and Trust for a comprehensive sign plan for additional signage for the Walmart Supercenter and an online grocery pick up service at 2400 North Franklin Street in the B-3, General Commercial District. The property is designated as Business/Commercial on the Future Land Use Map of the 2013 Christiansburg Comprehensive Plan.

Councilman Hall made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda, seconded by Councilman Bishop. Council voted on the motion as follows: Bishop – Aye; Collins – Aye; Hall – Aye; Huppert – Aye; Showalter – Aye; Stipes – Aye.

VI. CITIZEN COMMENTS

- A. Andy Schack, 1391 Dow Street, addressed Council with concerns regarding an illegal kennel at 1392 Dow Street that has been ongoing for about a year and a half, and houses approximately eighteen dogs in a three-bedroom house. The police, animal control, and Planning Director Andrew Warren have been involved in response to numerous complaints regarding excessive barking, the smell of feces, and dogs roaming the neighborhood. Citations have been issued, according to Mr. Schack, but the kennel operation has continued. Council was provided photographs of the property. Mr. Schack expressed concerns that the Town's noise ordinance was difficult to enforce, and he provided Council with a copy of the noise ordinance from Radford City, Salem, and Blacksburg to be used as models in writing and effective noise ordinance.

Faren Wolter, 1370 Dow Street, spoke in opposition of the kennel operation at 1392 Dow Street due to the number of dogs kept on the property, the dog turnover, and property neglect. Ms. Wolter lives directly behind the property and expressed concerns that the property owner has begun retaliating against neighbors who have complained. Ms. Wolter has a background in training dogs and has tried to work with the dogs' owner, without success or cooperation.

Ed Schack, 1391 Dow Street, said he believed the dogs' owner has avoided violations by manipulating the system/ordinance, even though the property and fencing is in disrepair, and dogs bark often and late into the evening. The property owner has a hearing coming up for a zoning violation, but the kennel operation has continued and property maintenance has continued to be neglected.

Robert Ambler, 365 Harkrader Street, shared his experience with a pack of four German Shepherds that escaped from 1392 Dow Street. According to Mr. Ambler, the dogs are frequently seen roaming the area, and on one occasion attempted to attack him and his Pomeranian in their own yard. Fortunately, he was able to run them off by spraying them with a water hose, then called the police. In addition, Mr. Ambler said the dogs could be heard barking constantly into the night, and it was not unusual to see the owners of the dogs walking the neighborhood looking for dogs that had escaped from their yard.

Councilman Stipes noted the large number of residents present due to concerns with the large number of dogs at 1392 Dow Street, and he thanked them for making Council aware of their concerns. Town Manager Wingfield reported that the property owner of 1392 Dow Street had been cited with a zoning violation and is in the process of appealing through the Board of Zoning Appeals. The BZA hearing is expected to take place in early December, and, according to Planning Director Andrew Warren, proper notification will be given once the date is scheduled. Mr. Warren said he would notify Council of the hearing date once scheduled. In addition, the property owner was given a summons for noise violations and that court date is scheduled for January 2018; Jerry Heinline, Building Official, is working with the property owner to remedy fencing that is in disrepair; and Montgomery County is involved with animal sheltering violations. Councilman Hall stated that the Town needed to review and appropriately amend its ordinances to provide clear guidelines on kennels and the number of dogs that could be kept on a property.

- B. Marty Gordon, 1470 Merrimac Road, provided Council with an update on the Christiansburg Arts Council meeting held on October 18. The arts council is seeking nominations for officer positions, and working on developing a Facebook page that will solicit arts, and the involvement of the public in identifying areas for potential art placement. Mr. Gordon spoke about the importance of art within the community in revitalization and encouraging tourism, and reported on the progress of current art projects that include a pet memorial on Roanoke Street. In closing, Mr. Gordon said that Town Manager Wingfield facilitated sending two Dogwood trees to sister-city Christiansburg, Ohio, through the Arbor Foundation. Christiansburg, Ohio plans to plant the trees in its downtown area with a plaque identifying them as being from Christiansburg, Virginia, and Mr. Gordon suggested representation from Christiansburg be present to help with the planting.

C. Christopher Sweet, 500 Gold Drive, introduced himself as a thirteen-year-old, seventh-grader who has served as a football team manager, and is currently involved in Boys Scouts, Big Brother/Big Sister Program, and the Boys and Girls Club. Christopher said the Town holds festivals for adults, and offers a variety of programs through the recreation center and the aquatic center, but believes there are less options and opportunities available for preteens and young teens. He offered ideas such as a pinewood derby festival, indoor putt-putt, or an RC remote control track. Christopher said he has learned through his involvement in Boys Scouts that there would be support from the teen community for activities like the ones he mentioned and he asked Council to take his suggestions into consideration. Council thanked Christopher for coming before Council and commended him on his willingness to bring his concerns and ideas to the Town. Councilman Hall asked him to talk with his troop leader about ways the Town could help to facilitate his ideas and to report back to Council. Councilman Showalter encouraged Christopher to also present his ideas to the Recreation Advisory Commission and the Aquatics Advisory Board.

VII. INTRODUCTIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

A. Engineering Director Wayne Nelson to provide a presentation to Council outlining the four Transportation Alternative Funding projects submitted on November 1, 2017 to the Virginia Department of Transportation. A Public Hearing is scheduled for November 21, 2017 at Town Hall from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm. The Public is invited to attend and provide comment in regards to these projects. Resolutions in support of these projects will be before Council at the November 28, 2017 Council meeting.

Director of Engineering Wayne Nelson introduced the Fiscal Year 2019-20 VDOT funding applications and provided details of each project. Funding applications for the Transportation Alternative Program were for (1) Roanoke Street sidewalk at Route 460 bypass (HSIP BikePed Application); (2) East Main Street sidewalk improvements; (3) Downtown Enhancement, Phase 3; and (4) Huckleberry Trail-head. Funding under the Transportation Alternative Program offers an 80%/20% match. Funding applications for the Revenue Sharing Program include (1) Roanoke Street/Tower Road/Hampton Boulevard Intersection; (2) Arbor Drive – Peppers Ferry Road Intersection; (3) Hickok Street Improvements, and offers funding as a 50%/50% match. Mr. Nelson informed Council of upcoming Public Hearings on the projects and noted that resolutions in support of the funding applications would be presented at the next regular council meeting for approval. Mr. Nelson noted that the funding period was for two years, and that he worked closely with Town departments and local VDOT Residency engineers in selecting the current projects. The Town should know in May 2018 which projects will be funded.

B. Continuation of the Christiansburg Town Council / Christiansburg High School Government Partnership. Christiansburg High School will be represented by Fin Jennings and Reegal Patel.

Councilman Collins introduced CHS students Fin Jennings and Reegal Patel who reported to Council on recent activities at the high school. On November 10, the Student Government Association hosted a Veterans Day parade and luncheon that was well attended and enjoyed. The Beta Club is currently organizing a Thanksgiving Basket Project that will deliver food baskets into the community, and in athletics, Cross Country Boys placed 3rd in State and Cross Country Girls placed 8th in State. Councilman Showalter pointed out that Fin Jennings was on the Christiansburg soccer team and scored the winning goal at the last game. He was also recently voted Homecoming King by his peers. Councilman Showalter went on to ask Fin and Reegal to continue conversations with lower classmen about the importance of the partnership with the Town to continue to grow and expand the program, and to seek input from students. Councilman Bishop, as a veteran, thanked CHS and the SGA for the Veterans Day parade and luncheon, which he appreciated and enjoyed.

VIII. COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. Street Committee report/recommendation on:

1. Plat of Survey Showing the Subdivision of Parcel 2A; Tax Parcel ID 436- 6 2A located at 100 Laurel Street for the Laurel Retail Revival Development - former Kmart property (2 parcels).

Councilman Stipes reported that the property was being redeveloped for an Aldi store, and the request to divide the property with one portion to be demolished, and the other _____. The Street Committee has reviewed the request and found it to conform with the subdivision ordinance. Councilman Stipes made a motion to approve the request as presented, seconded by Councilman Collins. Council voted on the motion as follows: Bishop – Aye; Collins – Aye; Hall – Aye; Huppert – Aye; Showalter – Aye; Stipes – Aye.

2. Plat of Survey for Street Renaming and Dedication/Vacation of Certain Private Easements in Oak Tree Phases XI, XII, and XIII on Pin Oak Drive and Twisted Oak Drive.

Councilman Stipes reported that the request was to rename a street and to modify a previously approved plat to allow for parking along the front of the townhomes, instead of in the rear by way of alleyways. Councilman Stipes noted that the Street Committee recommended approval and he made a motion to approve the request as presented. Councilman Collins seconded the request, and Council voted as follows: Bishop – Aye; Collins – Aye; Hall – Aye; Huppert – Aye; Showalter – Aye; Stipes – Aye.

B. Finance Committee report/recommendation on:

1. Budget Amendment 1 for FY 2017-2018.

Budget Amendment 1, along with a summary for explanation, was included in the agenda packet for Council review. The Public Hearing is scheduled for November 28, 2017.

IX. DISCUSSION BY MAYOR AND COUNCIL

A. Council action on:

1. Conditional Use Permit request by Elijah Bowen of Blue Ridge Motion LLC, agent for Kevin Carter, for a private recreational facility (gym) at 492 Reading Road, S.E., Unit D in the I-2 General Industrial District. The property is designated as Business/Commercial on the Future Land Use Map of the 2013 Christiansburg. The Public Hearing was held October 24, 2017. Town Manager Wingfield read the four conditions set forth in the Planning Commission resolution, and Councilman Collins commented that the Planning Commission worked with Town staff in carefully reviewing the parking situation before making its recommendation for approval. Councilman Hall made a motion to issue the CUP with four (4) conditions as recommended by the Planning Commission, seconded by Councilman Collins. Council voted on the motion as follows: Bishop – Aye; Collins – Aye; Hall – Aye; Huppert – Aye; Showalter – Aye; Stipes – Aye.
2. Updated application for annual support for community programs. Councilman Showalter stated that this was discussed in finance committee and that he had requested changes to strengthen the application process for those who request funding in annual budget. He had met with Finance Director Tweedie early on to develop an application process for proper vetting of requests. Councilman Showalter stated part of concerns are for town responsibility with taxpayer revenue, but also a desire to support organizations that serve and give back to the community. Finance Director Tweedie explained the updated application requirements. Councilman Hall, inquired if groups like child advocacy center would have blocks with these changes. Finance Director Tweedie stated the way it is set up, applicants would need to provide qualifying information and must have support from other sources. Councilman Bishop, asked about the requirement that capital improvement requests must be owned by applicant. Showalter stated that this was the intent of the finance committee. Councilman Bishop gave the community center as an example, which the Schaeffer Memorial Church owns, so the church would need to apply although the town typically does not give to churches. Councilman Showalter talked about different ways the community center could qualify for funds, including separating the properties and said that they could make a request outside of the application process though the town was trying to move support requests to this application process. There was a motion by Councilman Hall to table until next meeting to allow for further discussion, seconded by Councilman Huppert. Council agreed to table until the next meeting.

C. Councilman Stipes made a motion to amend the agenda to add a discussion of Council regarding Town support for the Montgomery County Chamber of Commerce annual dinner on December 7. Councilman Hall seconded the motion to open the discussion. Councilman Bishop requested that the recent NAACP dinner, attended by several Council members, be added to the discussion. Councilman Hall noted that to sponsor a table at the chamber dinner would cost \$750.00, and he expressed this would be difficult to justify as stewards of public dollars. It was noted that a community table at the recent NAACP dinner was \$600.00; the Council members who attended paid for their own tickets. Councilman Showalter agreed that the Town should be responsible stewards of town funds; however, other localities are well represented at several organizational dinners, often with no, or little, representation from Christiansburg. Mayor Barber noted that in years past the Town has paid for elected officials to attend dinners, with spouses paid out-of-pocket. Council expressed an interest in knowing the annual cumulative cost of dinners to review during budget preparation. Councilman Huppert stated that he could support paying for the mayor to represent the Town at dinners, but not purchasing an entire table due to the high cost, noting that the funds could be put to support businesses/organizations in better ways. Councilman Huppert urged Council to consider restrictions for some control, if it approved purchasing a table at the chamber dinner. Councilman Stipes made a motion to sponsor one table for ten at the Montgomery County Chamber of Commerce annual dinner, seconded by Councilman Showalter. Councilman Showalter said Council attending events at one table showed great support, and that Council often learned from the events and improved community relations. He stated his support for the matter to be included as a line item in the FY 2018-2019 annual budget. Councilman Bishop expressed his concern with the possible perception that Council was picking and choosing certain groups to support, since it did not present the same sponsorship support for the recent NAACP Freedom Fund, even though it had been discussed. Councilman Stipes said the Town should be selective in who it supports and he pledged his support for sponsoring a table at the NAACP Freedom Fund next year. Councilman Hall cautioned there were too many unknowns at this time to responsibly support the motion, and no policy or guidelines in place to provide direction for future sponsorship requests. Council voted on the motion as follows: Bishop – Nay; Collins – Aye; Hall – Nay; Huppert – Nay; Showalter – Aye; Stipes – Aye. Noting a tie, Mayor Barber voted Aye to pass the motion.

X. STAFF REPORTS

A. Town Manager Wingfield:

- A Public input meeting will be held on November 16 at 6:00 PM for the Cambria Street intersection and North Franklin Street corridor improvements.
- By consensus of Council, the December 26th regular council meeting was cancelled, with the option to reschedule if necessary.

C. Councilman Collins provided Council with information on the Virginia Main Street Program, and asked that they review the material and express their level of interest in participating.

D. Councilman Stipes congratulated Steve Huppert and Mayor Barber on their recent re-election, and welcomed newly-elected Council member Merissa Sachs.

E. Councilman Showalter reported on the October NRV Regional Commission meeting, noting that two members, Cecile Newcomb and Kevin Sullivan, would be leaving the commission at the end of the year. Mr. Showalter invited Council to attend the regional commission meeting on November 16.



THIS AGREEMENT, made and executed in triplicate this 27th day of May, 2015, by and between the **Town of Christiansburg, Virginia**, hereinafter referred to as the LOCALITY and the Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, the LOCALITY has expressed its desire to administer the work described in Appendix A, and such work for each improvement shown is hereinafter referred to as the Project; and

WHEREAS, the funds shown in Appendix A have been allocated to finance each Project; and

WHEREAS, the LOCALITY is committed to the development and delivery of each Project described in Appendix A in an expeditious manner; and;

WHEREAS, both parties have concurred in the LOCALITY's administration of the phase(s) of work for the respective Project(s) listed in Appendix A in accordance with applicable federal, state, and local law and regulations.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual premises contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The LOCALITY shall:

- a. Be responsible for all activities necessary to complete the noted phase(s) of each Project shown in Appendix A, except for activities, decisions, and approvals which are the responsibility of the DEPARTMENT, as required by federal or state laws and regulations or as otherwise agreed to, in writing, between the parties. Each Project will be designed and constructed to meet or exceed current American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials standards or supplementary standards approved by the DEPARTMENT
- b. Meet all funding obligation and expenditure timeline requirements in accordance with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations, and Commonwealth Transportation Board and DEPARTMENT policies and as identified in Appendix A to this Agreement. Noncompliance with this requirement can result in deallocation of the funding, rescinding of state

- c. Receive prior written authorization from the DEPARTMENT to proceed with preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and utility relocation, and construction phases of each Project.
- d. Administer the project(s) in accordance with guidelines applicable to Locally Administered Projects as published by the DEPARTMENT.
- e. Maintain accurate and complete records of each Project's development and documentation of all expenditures and make such information available for inspection or auditing by the DEPARTMENT. Records and documentation for items for which reimbursement will be requested shall be maintained for no less than three (3) years following acceptance of the final voucher on each Project.
- f. No more frequently than monthly, submit invoices with supporting documentation to the DEPARTMENT in the form prescribed by the DEPARTMENT. The supporting documentation shall include copies of related vendor invoices paid by the LOCALITY and an up-to-date project summary and schedule tracking payment requests and adjustments. A request for reimbursement shall be made within 90 days after any eligible project expenses are incurred by the Locality. For federally funded projects and pursuant to 2 CFR 200.338, Remedies for Noncompliance, violations of the provision may result in the imposition of sanctions including but not limited to possible denial or delay of payment of all or a part of the costs associated with the activity or action not in compliance.
- g. Reimburse the DEPARTMENT all Project expenses incurred by the DEPARTMENT if, due to action or inaction solely by the LOCALITY, federally funded Project expenditures incurred are not reimbursed by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), or reimbursements are required to be returned to the FHWA, or in the event the reimbursement provisions of Section 33.2-348 or Section 33.2-331 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, or other applicable provisions of federal, state, or local law or regulations require such reimbursement.
- h. On Projects that the LOCALITY is providing the required match to state or federal funds, pay the DEPARTMENT the LOCALITY's match for eligible Project expenses incurred by the DEPARTMENT in the performance of activities set forth in paragraph 2.a.
- i. Administer the Project in accordance with all applicable federal, state, or local laws and regulations. Failure to fulfill legal obligations associated with the project may result in forfeiture of federal or state-aid reimbursements
- j. Provide certification by a LOCALITY official that all LOCALITY administered Project activities have been performed in accordance with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations. If the locality expends over

\$750,000 annually in federal funding, such certification shall include a copy of the LOCALITY's single program audit in accordance with 2 CFR 200.501, Audit Requirements.

agreed to by the parties. There may be additional elements that, once identified, shall be addressed by the parties hereto in writing, which may require an amendment to this Agreement.

4. If designated by the DEPARTMENT, the LOCALITY is authorized to act as the DEPARTMENT's agent for the purpose of conducting survey work pursuant to Section 33.2-1011 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended.
5. Nothing in this Agreement shall obligate the parties hereto to expend or provide any funds in excess of funds agreed upon in this Agreement or as shall have been included in an annual or other lawful appropriation. In the event the cost of a Project is anticipated to exceed the allocation shown for such respective Project on Appendix A, both parties agree to cooperate in providing additional funding for the Project or to terminate the Project before its costs exceed the allocated amount, however the DEPARTMENT and the LOCALITY shall not be obligated to provide additional funds beyond those appropriated pursuant to an annual or other lawful appropriation.
6. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver of the LOCALITY's or the Commonwealth of Virginia's sovereign immunity.
7. The Parties mutually agree and acknowledge, in entering this Agreement, that the individuals acting on behalf of the Parties are acting within the scope of their official authority and the Parties agree that neither Party will bring a suit or assert a claim against any official, officer, or employee of either party, in their individual or personal capacity for a breach or violation of the terms of this Agreement or to otherwise enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The foregoing notwithstanding, nothing in this subparagraph shall prevent the enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Agreement by or against either Party in a competent court of law.
8. The Parties mutually agree that no provision of this Agreement shall create in the public, or in any person or entity other than the Parties, rights as a third party beneficiary hereunder, or authorize any person or entity, not a party hereto, to maintain any action for, without limitation, personal injury, property damage, breach of contract, or return of money, or property, deposit(s), cancellation or forfeiture of bonds, financial instruments, pursuant to the terms of this Agreement or otherwise. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, unless otherwise provided, the Parties agree that the LOCALITY or the DEPARTMENT shall not be bound by any agreements between the either party and other persons or entities concerning any matter which is the subject of this Agreement, unless and until the LOCALITY or the DEPARTMENT has, in writing, receive a true copy of such agreement(s) and has affirmatively agreed, in writing, to be bound by such Agreement.
9. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon 30 days advance written notice. Eligible Project expenses incurred through the date of termination shall be

reimbursed in accordance with paragraphs 1.f, 1.g., and 2.b, subject to the limitations established in this Agreement and Appendix A. Upon termination, the DEPARTMENT shall retain ownership of plans, specifications, and right of way, unless all state and federal funds provided for the Project have been reimbursed to the DEPARTMENT by the LOCALITY, in which case the LOCALITY will have ownership of the plans, specifications, and right of way, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon in writing.

10. Prior to any action pursuant to paragraphs 1.b or 1.g of this Agreement, the DEPARTMENT shall provide notice to the LOCALITY with a specific description of the breach of agreement provisions. Upon receipt of a notice of breach, the LOCALITY will be provided the opportunity to cure such breach or to provide a plan to cure to the satisfaction to the DEPARTMENT. If, within sixty (60) days after receipt of the written notice of breach, the LOCALITY has neither cured the breach, nor is diligently pursuing a cure of the breach to the satisfaction of the DEPARTMENT, then upon receipt by the LOCALITY of a written notice from the DEPARTMENT stating that the breach has neither been cured, nor is the LOCALITY diligently pursuing a cure, the DEPARTMENT may exercise any remedies it may have under this Agreement.

THE LOCALITY and DEPARTMENT acknowledge and agree that this Agreement has been prepared jointly by the parties and shall be construed simply and in accordance with its fair meaning and not strictly for or against any party.

THIS AGREEMENT, when properly executed, shall be binding upon both parties, their successors, and assigns.

THIS AGREEMENT may be modified in writing by mutual agreement of both parties.

- Government wide financial statements vs fund balance statements
 - Government Wide financial statements Pg. 25 -28 present all the capital assets and depreciation of the government as well as the long term debt and long term pension liabilities that are not reflected in the fund level financial statements. (economic resources measurement focus and full accrual basis.)
 - Fund level financial statements report on a shorter time horizon and do not reflect these long term assets and debt the same way but account for assets as they are purchased and debt as the payments are made. (Current financial resources measurement and modified accrual basis)
 - You will see a reconciliation of these statements on pages 28 and 30.
 - From either perspective the Town has a strong fund balance and a good outlook.

- Also related to the Petersburg Crisis is the new financial stress test that is now being performed by the APA on prior year audits.
- We are happy to report that the Town of Christiansburg had good scores on all the test ratios preformed.




REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES AS COMPARED TO BUDGET

BUDGET TO ACTUAL GEN FUND AND WATER SEWER ENTERPRISE







FUND BALANCE POLICY

Fund balance Goals General fund

The Town shall seek to maintain unassigned fund balance of between 35-40% of all expenditures in the preceding fiscal year. Expenditures shall include operating expenses (excluding capital) of the general fund, permanent fund and enterprise fund, less any unassigned fund balance in the permanent fund and the enterprise fund. If the unassigned fund balance after conclusion of the annual audit exceeds 45% a review shall be conducted and appropriate actions shall be taken. If the unassigned fund balance is less than 30% a plan shall be developed to restore the reserves in an acceptable manner under the circumstances.

TOWN OF CHRISTIANSBURG AUDIT SUMMARY 2017

- Overall how did we do and how are we?
 - In general we saw some improvement in all our revenue numbers, growth was small but steady.
 - Revenues were slightly higher than budgeted and expenditures were less than budgeted.
 - Fund balance INCREASED by almost \$5.1 million primarily as a result of capital project rollovers, additional reserves and liquidity remains good.
 - Our unassigned fund balance is at 60.76% after consideration of fund balance use in the FY 2018 budget and additional amounts to reserves. This is a little on the high side, however we may want to hold on any action relative to this until we get a better look at FY 2018 budget amendments and a few other strategic goals.

ITEM HISTORY:

For the past five years we have been using the same application for community organizations requesting support from the town. The finance committee requested that we update the application and place some additional requirements on receiving support funds from the Town.

On 11-1-2017 the attached support application was reviewed and discussed by the finance committee and finance committee recommended it be sent to Council for approval for our upcoming grant application cycle. New applications for the upcoming budget are due February 1, of 2018.

Changes to the application include the following:

A cash or in kind match of volunteer hours will now be required.

Support for capital building improvements will only be awarded if the building is owned by the requesting organization. (Does not apply if the building is on the National Register of Historic Places or the Virginia Landmarks Register)

New format of how information is to be presented.

Request for disbursement of funds will need to be provided before payment will be made and supporting documentation of cash or in kind match must be provided.

Requests for disbursement of awarded funds must be received by May 15 or funding will be denied.

GRANT MATCH REQUIREMENT:

All grant recipients must provide either a cash match from fundraising efforts OR an in kind match of volunteer hours. Each volunteer hour equals \$20 of cash match. For example a \$1000 award will require 50 volunteer hours. Cash match may come from state or federal grants, fund



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raising efforts, or other non-committed funds on hand. For example if you have a state award of \$5000 and need a match for that grant of \$1000 that award will serve as the cash match. The cash match is dollar for dollar. If you are requesting \$1000 you must provide \$1000 of cash match.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUNDS:

Funds requested for capital building improvements may be provided only if the following terms are met:

Organization owns the property to be improved (*this does not apply to properties that are on the National Historic Register and or the Virginia Landmarks Register*)

Organization will allow Town to use the property at least once annually at no cost

Organization must have building or street signage displaying organization name and hours of operation.

REPORTING AND DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS:

The financial report at the end of this document must be submitted before funds will be disbursed and must be filed no later than **May 15th** of the fiscal in which the grant was awarded. If the funds were awarded for fiscal year 2019-2020 then the report is due by May 15, 2020. Reports received after this date will not be funded.

Supporting documents such as invoices or log of volunteer hours **must** be provided with the report to demonstrate compliance with the match requirement and substantiation of the use of funds.
