COMMUNITY CORNER

Huckleberry Improvements

The Huckleberry Trail has seen a few additions over the summer.

The Town received a grant to install sunscreen dispensers along the trail and in Town parks. Visit these yellow stands for free sunscreen and use the mirror on the front to help apply it.



Other safety improvements have been made as well. In July and August, emergency call towers were installed along the trail and at Downtown Park, Depot Park and Harkrader Sports Complex. By October, six solar-powered towers will be operational along the Huckleberry Trail, which will allow users to send an immediate 911 call to the regional dispatch center with the

location of the tower. The individual who pushed the button will then be able to communicate with a dispatcher.

These towers are a proactive measure that add an extra sense of security for trail users and are also useful in the case of medical emergencies.

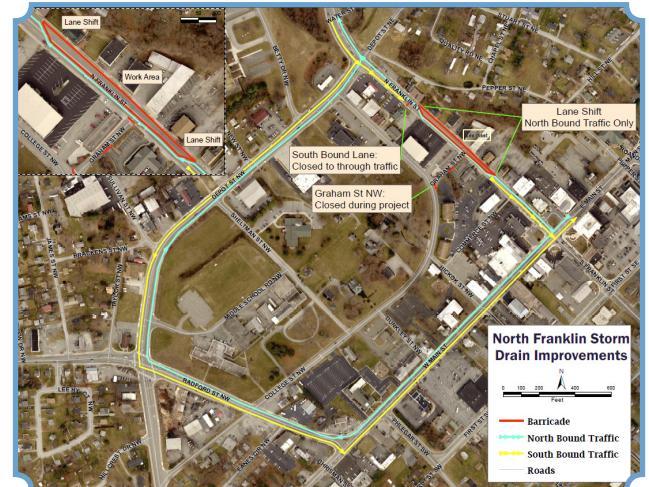
CAPITAL PROJECTS UPDATE

Over the past months, you have probably noticed construction work happening in the downtown area of Christiansburg. The work and corresponding road closures are the result of two different projects, both of which will be wrapping up in the coming weeks.

In the spring, a sewer project began on North Franklin Street in downtown and has now moved its way to Commerce Street. The purpose of this project is to reduce the number of sanitary sewer overflows in the downtown area that have been caused by aging infrastructure, portions of which are from the Town's original sewer collection system that was installed in the 1930s. The sewer system's upgrades include increasing its capacity and shifting its path.

The Town is continuing its efforts with the contractor to complete this project as soon as possible. A portion of Hickok Street that is normally open to traffic will remain closed for roughly two more weeks. The contractor will be responsible for repaving Commerce Street and corresponding parking lots.

After the sewer project moved off North Franklin Street, a different project began on a smaller portion of the same road. A storm drain project began in the summer to realign storm drains that currently flow under local businesses. The purpose of this project is to reduce flooding in the area. This project includes blasting of rock underground, which is a process controlled and monitored by the Christiansburg Fire Department. Currently, the plan is to maintain one lane of northbound traffic at all times throughout the project, except when the 10-minute blasts take place. In order to maintain one lane of northbound traffic, the contractor has shifted traffic to other portions of the road. The farthest right northbound lane that has been open since the sewer project began has been redirected to the farthest southbound lane. Please see the map below for a visual depiction. This project is on schedule and is expected to be complete by the end of October.

FALL CLEANUP

Fall Cleanup will take place October
5–18. Please place materials in a
separate pile from your regular trash
within 10 feet of the street. Fall cleanup
items may be collected outside of your
regular trash collection day. Items that
will be accepted include: furniture;
appliances, including sinks and tubs (2
per household); passenger car and truck
tires (4 per household and no larger
than 20-inches); tire rims (no limit); tree
limbs, tree stumps, trimmings, brush;
leaves (must be bagged); landscape
timbers; open and dry paint cans and
sealer cans; dry barrels/drums with ends
removed that did not contain hazardous
material; railroad ties/timbers (5 per
