

SHOPPING & DINING

Cambria

Visit Cambria for a peek into the region's past. In early summer, join our community to watch Norfolk & Western's 611 steam locomotive as it travels through Christiansburg. You'll also find gift shops, antiques, artisans and Amelia's Pizzeria.



Downtown

Downtown is the place to go for the annual Christmas Parade, Fourth of July Celebration and other events like the Food Truck Rodeo. From May-October, find fresh produce at the Farmers' Market on Hickok Street.

Roanoke Street Corridor




Uptown

ABOUT



The Town of Christiansburg is tucked between the slopes of the Blue Ridge Mountains and the winding path of the New River in southwest Virginia. With our tight-knit community; numerous recreational, commercial and cultural destinations; and proximity to higher education institutions, it's no wonder we are known as "the place to be."

Originally a concentration of taverns and rest stops along the Great Wilderness Road (now US Route 11), the 1.1-square-mile town was established in 1792 and later incorporated in 1833. Famous residents and visitors include Davy Crockett, Daniel Boone and Booker T. Washington.

Christiansburg is now 14 square-miles and is the fourth largest town in Virginia with 21,041 residents (2010 census). The Town serves as Montgomery County's seat and retail hub. With Virginia Tech, Radford University, New River Community College, two major hospitals and the I-81 corridor nearby, we're a diverse, collegiate, commercial and professional community with a small-town vibe. From local restaurants and mom-and-pop antique shops to recreation opportunities, there's something for everyone here.

AQUATICS



The Christiansburg Aquatic Center is home to a 50-meter, Olympic-sized pool; a 1- and 3-meter spring board; and a 10-meter diving platform. The state-of-the-art facility has a leisure pool with dumping buckets; spray features; a two-story, triple-loop waterslide; and a 20-meter, four-lane lap pool. Catch some rays on the sundeck outside the leisure pool or eat lunch on one of the many picnic tables.
