
### Plants Around Town

4. Canna Toucan Scarlet, *Canna generalis*




5. West Indian Lantana, *Lantana camara*




6. Senorita Rosalita "Spider Flower," *Cleome hybrid*




7. Giant Coneflower, *Rudbeckia maxima*




8. May Night Meadow Sage, *Salvia x sylvestris*

## IN THE KNOW

School may be out for the summer, but the Town of Christiansburg is staying busy. The budget for fiscal year 2021–2022 was adopted on June 22 (see below). Water rates are scheduled to increase on July 1. Learn more on page 2. Independence Day is observed on July 5 this year. Solid waste that would normally be collected on Monday, July 5, will be collected on Friday, July 2. The Town's annual Fourth of July Celebration will be on July 3. The festival downtown will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., and fireworks will be launched from the new park location at 9:15 p.m. You can view them from the Uptown Christiansburg and Walmart parking lots.


## TOWN COUNCIL APPROVES FY 2021-22 BUDGET

Town Council approved the annual budget for fiscal year 2021–2022 on June 22.

Water rates increased to \$9 per month for 1,000 gallons, \$11 per 1,000 gallons consumed between 1,000–50,000 gallons per month, and \$8.25 per 1,000 gallons in excess of 50,000 gallons. These rates are effective July 1 (more information on next page). Sewer rates remain unchanged. Real estate and personal property tax rates remain unchanged. Four new positions were added—one in Fire, one in Rescue and two in Parks and Recreation.

## DRINKING WATER QUALITY REPORT

In 2020, the Town of Christiansburg detected ten regulated and one unregulated contaminants in the drinking water. However, these contaminants were at allowable levels and no health-based violations were reported. ## WATER RATES CHANGING

New water rates were adopted July 1 at \$9 per month for 1,000 gallons, \$11 per 1,000 gallons consumed between 1,000–50,000 gallons per month, and \$8.25 per 1,000 gallons in excess of 50,000 gallons. Sewer rates remain unchanged. Increased rates are due to the New River Valley Regional Water Authority, which sells water wholesale to the Town of Christiansburg, raising its prices. This means Christiansburg and other Authority customers (Blacksburg, Virginia Tech and Montgomery County) must cover the higher cost. The Authority's rate change will fund essential upgrades to the water treatment plant and system, which have not received major improvements in 40 years. Christiansburg's wastewater treatment facility is also in need of upgrades. The increase ensures customers will continue receiving quality water. Despite the change, Christiansburg continues to have affordable water and sewer rates when compared to many other jurisdictions in the state.

## HAZARDOUS WASTE

Did you know that dumping anything down a drain or manhole into the wastewater system is illegal? Gasoline, diesel and chemicals may produce an explosive environment in the pipes that lead right to your home or business. Yikes! Talk about a big bang...

Please properly dispose of unwanted gasoline, motor oil or chemicals by contacting the New River Resource Authority at 540-674-1677. A free collection event is scheduled for September 11, 2021. You may call in August to make an appointment.

Reminder, please flush only the 3 Ps—pee, poo and paper. Even if the packaging says so, wipes are not flushable and can clog pipes, causing costly repairs for you and the Town.
