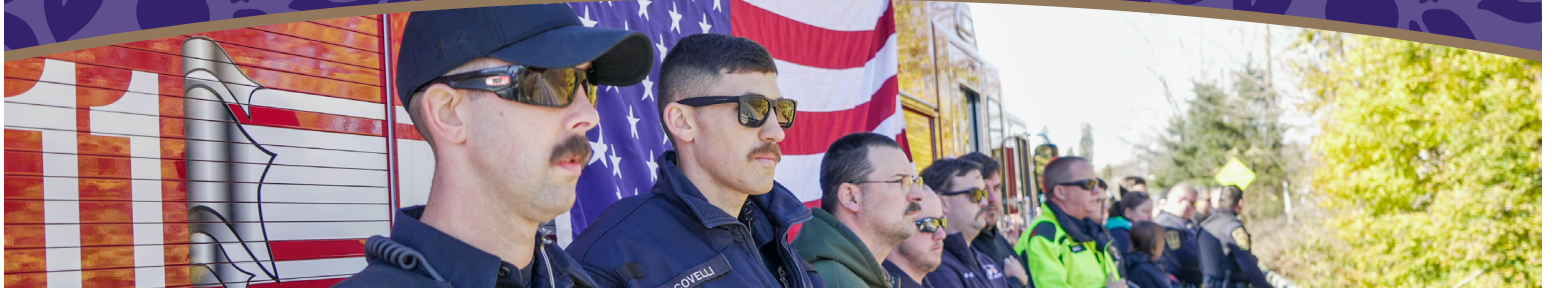

## COMMUNITY HEALTH: PLEASE SCOOP THE POOP

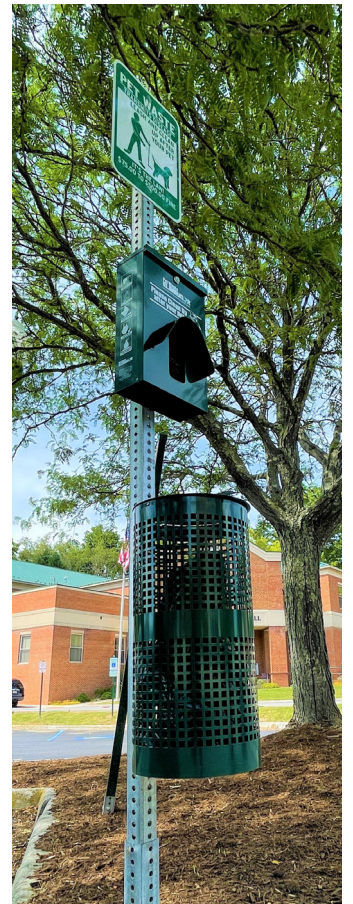
Christiansburg has beautiful streams that provide recreational, aesthetic and health benefits for everyone to enjoy. However, these waterways are considered impaired, or overloaded, with E. coli. This means that the Town must take actions to monitor and reduce the bacteria levels present in the water as part of its Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) program, which aims to improve overall water quality.

Many may not realize that a large contributor to waterway impairment is from the bacteria found in pet waste. When pet waste is left on the ground, it gets washed away by rain into stormwater drains and eventually carried out to streams in Town.

Studies by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) show that pet waste can contribute to nearly 20 percent of the bacteria found in waterways. The presence of this bacteria can be harmful to the health of residents and their pets.

So, please scoop the poop. This is an easy way to do your part to save yourself and your neighbors from harmful exposure to bacteria, and as an added bonus, it also keeps our community beautiful.

Bagged pet waste can be disposed with household trash, but if you're out walking through town, you can find these pet waste stations (pictured) in downtown, along trails and in our community parks. Be sure to thoroughly wash your hands, then log your efforts to keep our town safe at our MS4 Public Participation App at <http://arcg.is/1iC0aL0>.

## WINTER WEATHER

If you have a sidewalk in front of your home/business, please keep it clear of snow and ice. Town Code requires it be cleared within 24 hours of your street being plowed.

Snow plowing will deposit snow along street shoulders, curbs and driveway openings. Because of this, it is recommended that residents shovel driveways **after** their street is plowed.

When facing the street, shovel snow to the right or into your yard to minimize the amount that may get plowed back into your driveway.

If inclement weather is expected, please avoid parking on the street. Parking on the street prevents snow plows from fully and safely clearing the street and may result in vehicle damage.
