WINTER WEATHER PREPAREDNESS



Winter is coming, and it never hurts to brush up on our winter weather knowledge before the first snow of the season.

In anticipation of incoming winter weather, Public Works crews will apply salt brine to the roads. Crews will also de-ice roads and plow snow. Primary roads (main thoroughfares with a high traffic volume) are always cleared first to ensure that snow removal crews and emergency vehicles are able to access all areas in

town. There are over 50 primary roads in the Town of Christiansburg.

Non-primary roads are considered secondary roads. During winter weather, secondary roads are treated and cleared in alternating order so the same streets are not always addressed last. There are over 400 secondary roads in the Town of Christiansburg. Because of the large number of streets requiring attention, Public Works crews cannot respond to special requests to clear roads for medical, work or other reasons.

During the winter, you may notice an increase in the number of water line breaks around Town. This is perfectly normal. As the seasons change, temperatures fluctuate, causing the ground to shift. This means water lines can shift as well, which sometimes leads to a break. To report a water line break during normal business hours, please call the Public Works Department at 540-382-1151. If you need to report a break after business hours, please call the Police Department's nonemergency line at 540-382-4343.

LOOSE LEAF COLLECTION

Whatever you have lost, or are grieving (a death, a divorce, the loss of a dear pet, or something else precious to you), journaling is a research-confirmed strategy to help you cope.
