In Memoriam: Bill Aldridge 1958-2017

The Town of Christiansburg mourns the loss of Bill Aldridge, a beloved Town employee and member of our community. Bill, a Town building inspector of 11 years, passed away unexpectedly from a heart attack in August. He was 59.

Bill was loved dearly by all who knew him and will be sorely missed. He will be remembered at Town Hall for filling his coworkers' offices with balloons on their birthdays; greeting everyone with fist bumps, peace signs and secret handshakes; and sending people beautiful cards "just because."

Bill was an advocate for Christiansburg and was always looking for ways to make our town better. He helped launch the Christiansburg Farmers' Market because he wanted a place downtown where the community could gather, eat good food and listen to live music – one of his favorite activities.

His sense of public service extended beyond his office at Town Hall. Bill announced Auburn High School boys and girls basketball games for 17 years, and also announced at benefit tournaments that raised money for causes such as cancer research. He always lent a helping hand to those in need and was well known for his acts of kindness.

Thank you for everything, Bill. You will never be forgotten by those who had the good fortune of knowing you.

Newly renovated VDOT park and ride ready for use

After three years of renovation, Virginia Department of Transportation's new park and ride opened at the intersection of Roanoke Street and the Route 460 Bypass.

The park and ride was named the Kenneth B. Gibson Memorial Park and Ride in memory of Army Seargent Kenneth B. Gibson, a soldier from Christiansburg who was killed while serving in Iraq.

The \$5.6 million project was funded by VDOT and federal funds. Construction added about 210 parking spaces and installed new lighting, sidewalks, bus shelters, bike racks and handicap accomodations.

Now that the park and ride is open, take advantage of its free parking and catch a bus to a number of destinations! In addition to local routes, like the Smart Way bus which connects the New River and Roanoke valleys, Megabus runs a route from Knoxville, Tenn. to Washington, D.C. that makes three stops at the park and ride per day.

Frequently Asked...

When is fall cleanup?

Fall Cleanup will take place Oct. 7-20. Please place materials in a separate pile from your regular trash within 10 feet of the street. Fall cleanup items may be collected outside of your regular trash collection day.

What items are accepted?

Furniture; appliances, including sinks and tubs (limit 2 per household); **passenger car & truck tires** (limit 4 per household; no larger than 20-inches); **tire rims** (no limit); **tree limbs, tree stumps, trimmings, brush; leaves** (must be loose, do not bag); **landscape timbers; paint cans and sealer cans** (only if open and dry); **barrels/drums** (only if dry, ends are removed and did not contain hazardous material); **railroad ties/timbers** (limit 5 per household).
